So, I know pretty much nothing about jazz, but that's not going to stop me reviewing 'Midnight Blue', by Kenny Burrell. You know what? I think I'll do a good job. I might go into weird directions, but I'll be insightful, or at least use correct grammar most if not all of the time. Let's start with something positive: Mr. Burrell is still alive at the time of writing. He's 89 years old! Let's pray he doesn't die immediately after posting this review. I remember my secondary school guitar teacher kept (unsuccessfully) trying to force jazz onto me, and this was one of the albums. I do like it, just not that much.
