Maybe the artist has moved on to work where he actually gets paid). Of course it's good that crime can be turned into something positive, but if you want to have a really beneficial effect on society, why not do something to fight knife crime first? Personally I'm not really even that bothered if I get something on my shoe. It's just a shoe. You know what else London is famous for? Jack the Ripper. He took knife crime to a whole new level. Let's Google 'RHCP controversies' to see if they were sued...
