Today I'll be reviewing The Best of Rory Gallagher by you guessed it, Rory Gallagher. Have you ever heard of a best of album by an artist that was actually by someone else? Probably not, so was there any point of saying the best of Rory album was by Rory? Probably not. In comparison, a poor soul in a made up but confusing situation could be like 'The best of Metallica by Dragonforce? Huh.' A real brain scratcher. Agony. He'd continue... 'Hm, are dragons metal? Nope, so that doesn't work. Hang on, I can think of metal things that are forceful though, now I'm getting somewhere. I'm sure I'll find the connection between those two bands soon.'
