James: ...

7th: Cast

James: Most people would dislike witches casting spells more than judges, but I'm not most people.

Paul: You like witches AND bombs more than Dan?

James: To be fair though, what bad do witches do really? Let them keep their brooms, black cats and spells, they don't do anything.

Paul: Some people are allergic to cats.

James: You're suggesting witches find people who are allergic to cats and rub cats on them?

Paul: They might get frustrated when their spells don't work...

James: Well I've never heard of that happening.

Paul: Do you know much about witches?

James: Yes. Dan's a witch.

Paul: Can men be witches?

James: Ok, he's a warlock, or maybe a sorcerer.

James: He better not do that.

6th: Unlike

James: Please don't unlike me.
