Today I'll be reviewing 'Two Angels and a Dream' by Depswa. The band have been on 'hiatus' since 2011? Does 14 years seem like a bit of a long break to you? Seems like they've split up to me. I had to Google what 'hiatus' meant. I knew it at least kind of meant 'break' but I was thinking it could have meant 'holiday', as well. What kind of party animals holiday so intensely?
