(A door opens and shuts)

James: Moving on, if any listeners want to troll their friends, I'm performing the same show in a different city, tomorrow...

Dan: I don't believe you...

James: Yes, whilst I annoyed a lot of people I did actually made those involved with the show a lot of money...

Ben: That can't be legal.

James: Oh very much so. So tell your friends they'll be seeing the show of their lives. A show that will inspire beyond belief. Then the audience leave really angry, made even worse by the fact I'm profiting off that.

Dan: James, stop. Please. I understand no one is ever going to hire you so this podcast is the only thing you can do...
