OLD MAN Hardcore Sects... JAMES I'm sorry, this library doesn't really have books like that ... OLD MAN No, it's right in my hand, right now. JAMES Are you sure? OLD MAN Sure as I can be. JAMES Is it good? OLD MAN Apparently. JAMES Is the story captivating?

OLD MAN Sure is. It's about the most extreme religious groups in the world.

JAMES

I don't understand.

A 50 year old SHOPKEEPER enters the room and approaches JAMES.

SHOPKEEPER Is everything ok?

JAMES I don't know what to do, this person's a freak who doesn't seem to care at all...

OLD MAN I want a book called Hardcore Sects!

SHOPKEEPER Do you know what a sect is, James? Spelt 'S E C T'?

SHOPKEEPER

JAMES!

INT. CHARITY SHOP - DAY

JAMES wears a T-shirt and stands behind a cashier, looking depressed. By his sides are all sorts of random stuff, from old clothes on racks, CDs on shelves, stacked computer consoles, etc. An OLD MAN wearing glasses approaches JAMES.

> OLD MAN Hello! Do you know why I'm here?

> > JAMES

OLD MAN

Guess!

JAMES

Why?

OLD MAN

JAMES Ok... Do you want to donate your shoes?

OLD MAN No... Maybe I'd want to donate my glasses?

JAMES frowns.

JAMES No, I know how important they are...

OLD MAN Correct. Maybe I have something in my pockets?

JAMES

Yes?

OLD MAN Yes! But what? JAMES

Coins?

OLD MAN No! Pot noodle sachets!

JAMES Oh. What flavour?

OLD MAN Bombay Bad Boy!

JAMES

Oh, nice.

OLD MAN I want £50 for them.

JAMES shakes the OLD MAN'S hand.
