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Today, I'll be reviewing Back in Black by AC/DC. Apparently the band got their name from looking at the back of a sewing machine, but forget that, it's catchy. Obviously dumb when you think about it, just as calling a band 'On/Off Switch' would be dumb, but don't judge a book by its cover and all that. 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works...

Interestingly, AC/DC have an album called 'For Those About to Rock (We Salute You).' Pretty harmless right? Well, actually on the album cover there's a picture of a cannon. Yes, cannons can be used as a form of saluting, but do you trust these people? Who's to say they won't get confused and shoot YOU? Especially as the tone is dark and heavy in the title song. If it was more optimistic it wouldn't be so bad. Compare the sentences 'Come with me, if you want to live:)' and 'COME WITH ME IF YOU WANT TO LIVE!!! >:(' Who are you going to trust? Anyway, time to wrap this review up. Despite what I've just said, this is a fun album. You know what? Let's give it a solid 9 out of 10. It's not perfect, but it's fun! Bye!
