James: Terrifying... Absolutely terrifying.

Ben: We've just had a couple of text messages, that's all.

Simon: Sure we know what they're saying now, but what will the next message say?

Ben: What are you scared of?

Simon: The phone could say it needs to be topped up... Then what?

Dan: You see, I'd think getting the abuse from us would be much worse than a top up

message...

(Multiple beeps are heard)

Dan: Wow, I've just had a ton of messages!

Ben: Me too!

Dan: It should be pointed out that James and Simon are foaming at the mouths and look possessed. Anyway one message says 'Dan' the next says 'this' the next says 'is' the next says 'really' and the last one says 'funny.'

(A beeping sound is heard)

James: It was a fake message, wasn't it? It was sent to you by the producer of this show as a prank.

Ben: Ok, fine it was a prank...

Dan: No!

Ben: ... but you need to accept the fact topping up phones is just a part of life!

James: What's topping up mean then?

Ben: Adding money to your phone so you can use it more.

James: It really is that simple?

Ben: It's that simple.

James: It has nothing to do with death, then?

Ben: What?? No!

Dan: Why would your mobile phone kill you?

James: I don't know. Why would anyone kill someone?

Dan: Oh come on, a mobile phone trying to kill its customers would be EXTREMELY

bad for business!

Simon: Everyone who kills someone has to face very severe consequences...

Dan: You don't actually agree with James, do you??

Simon: There are bad people everywhere, so there are bad phone companies, too.

(A phone rings)

Caller: Hello, I'm the CEO of a mobile phone company that wants to kill its customers, and as I'm considered crazy, I really was hoping for other crazy people to promote my company, and I think James and Simon are a good fit.

James: See this is exactly what I mean. No I don't want you to sponsor me.

Caller: Please. Business is really bad right now and we need someone to advertise

for us. Someone like you.

James: No!

Caller: We're going to have to declare bankruptcy! Not one person has subscribed to

my company, no one!

Ben: I'll hang him up for you.

Dan: It seems we need to apologise to James and Simon for saying text messages

are harmless...

James: Told you.

Dan: I'm glad you told a homicidal phone company CEO to leave you alone, by the way. We all know how hard it is for people to sponsor you.

James: Thank you.

(The phone rings again)

Caller: Look, I'll make a deal. No murder, you're against it, I get that. How about me and my employees go around hitting people? THAT'S ALL.

Ben: Well, how's that sound James? Simon?

Simon: I think what we're all wondering is... why?

Caller: A gap in the market...

Simon: Is it a gap people are talking about a lot?

Caller: Oh believe me, lots of people are talking about my phone company!

Simon: But no one wants to do business with you?

Caller: That's what I'm trying to wrap my head around...

Ben: I'll hang him up again.

James: See the darkness of mobile phones, now?

Ben: Now, now, don't put other people out there off buying from 100% trustworthy companies...

James: They're all shady!

Ben: Where did you get your phobia of phones? I mean, have you ever got a text message about topping up phones that you perceived as threatening?

James: No.
