Giving pi or pie to the universe will surely help things, contrary to what many will believe. I'm always welcome to the idea of people giving me any kind of pie, it really is very much appreciated. Unless it is so sugary it triggers a diabetic coma, I mean. You'd think a pie containing nothing but sugar would be too sweet to enjoy, but believe me I like pretty much all desserts. Maybe that's how pi/pie could destroy the universe, give it medical problems? No. I've said pi doesn't destroy everything and I'm sticking to that. Maybe a palindrome could save the universe, simply because they look cool? I think the code to launch nukes was 00000000 and that's a palindrome. Not the most varied sure, but there is a beauty to its simplicity. How can such a number be bad, then? Well, number theory is one tough subject. Even I don't fully get it and I made it up.

To conclude, maybe numbers can't actually blow the universe up. Maybe a couple of words so depressing could make the universe WANT to blow up (i.e. 'stupid universe'), but even then I think that's unlikely. The universe is super ultra massive and filled with incredible things and therefore I think it can handle being called stupid. It probably won't LIKE it, but there is surely no reason to be concerned. I hope no

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one is thinking 'that Simon's gone mad, he keeps obsessing how to destroy absolutely everything...' Not true at all, I was thinking of numbers as I often do at the gym, and then I got the idea for this monologue. That's all. :) Maybe subconsciously I was thinking of blowing everything up because the people there were annoying me? That could be true, but having thought very deeply, I don't think it is. Which is good. And on that very safe and peaceful note... Bye!
