Today, I'll be reviewing 'Too Fast For Love' by Motley Crue. How fast is too fast for love anyway? The speed of sound? For all I know, it could be 1000 mph, if so THAT'S fast. Too fast for love should be a measurement fighter jets fly at, shortened to maybe love 1 or love 2. That's much more fun than saying 'mach'. Say you want to train a fighter pilot, but he's scared of flying. Then you explain to him he will be doing some loving (well not in those words, that sounds pervy) and all of a sudden, he is super enthusiastic if slightly pacified through mushiness. I'm hoping I can relate to that song forever. You'd think it would be fun. Nope.

However, it seems some guy kept saying the phrase over and over again as the instrument really does stand out as very loud in this album. Motley Crue will probably be embarrassed if they ever find out the phrase is often meant humorously. Whoops. On the whole however, a damn fine album that I think deserves an amazing 9.25/10! Bye!
