Today, I'll be reviewing 'The Blue Album' by Weezer. I own something like 1,200 to 1,300 albums and is TBA a contender for my elite top 10?? Maybe! My 5th fave album is probably Ten by Pearl Jam, coming in at number four is The Stone Roses, in third is Nine Inch Nails' 'Pretty Hate Machine', second is Hum's 'You'd Prefer an Astronaut' and of course in first is Deftones' 'White Pony'. Good luck shifting THOSE. The Hum album is probably the least well known of the five, I think because of the name. Say you're browsing in a CD shop and you want to try something new and random. Then you see a release called 'You'd Prefer an Astronaut'. Then you subconsciously think to yourself 'Ok, I'll get something else, then.' Next thing you know, you're buying a Lego spaceship. My local curry house is very good as well. However, whilst binging on any food will have negative health consequences, the only downside of listening to the same album over and over again in one session is that it will get annoying. For physical health the band get a 10! For mental health however, extreme overuse of the band will give them maybe a 5. The beginning of track 8 'In the Garage' sounds like the theme tune of the most disappointing children's birthday party of all time, but even so, I do actually like it. Interestingly the lyrics admit the band writes stupid songs which sounds terrible and certainly not deserving of a 9.9, especially as the singing is out of tune sometimes as well, but no it is awesome. The following track begins like a Queen song but with out of tune guitars that time around, so should I give a 9.8 instead? No! And bye!
